

Privacy and Access Odds & Ends:

“Is Health PEI permitted to provide information about our patients/clients/residents to Elections PEI or Elections Canada?”

- The *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and *Health Information Act* both permit us to disclose an individual’s information without consent where it is required to comply with or authorized by another provincial or federal law.
- Elections PEI and Elections Canada have authority under their respective laws to **maintain a register of electors** that includes each person’s:
 - Residential address
 - Mailing address
 - Legal name
 - Contact information
 - Date of birth (month, day and year)
- According to the applicable legislation Health PEI is required to provide this information.



Important Note: The *Provincial Health Number Act* does not permit collection of personal health numbers (PHNs) for any non-health related purpose. *The Elections Act* does not prevail over the *Provincial Health Number Act* – PHNs should not be provided for this purpose.

Important Things to Consider:

- Health PEI should only disclose the minimum amount of information required to meet the purpose for the collection.
- This request for information must be made to a Health PEI staff person who can authorize the disclosure (i.e. the Administrator of a facility).
- The information must be transmitted through secure means. Emailing information outside of the Government email system (email addresses that do not end with @gov.pe.ca or @ihis.org) is not secure.
- If information is provided directly, appropriate ID and/or credentials should be confirmed before releasing the information.
- Use professional judgment and if you feel you need more information about the request, including what information is necessary for this purpose, reach out to the requestor for clarification.
