

## Health Canada implemented <u>mandatory reporting</u> of Serious Adverse Drug Reactions for all Canadian Hospitals in December 2019. This is also referred to as <u>Vanessa's Law</u>.

A serious adverse drug reaction (ADR) is a noxious and unintended response to a drug that occurs at any dose and:

- requires in-patient hospitalization or prolongation of existing hospitalization;
- causes congenital malformation;
- · results in persistent or significant disability or incapacity;
- is life-threatening; or
- results in death.

Health PEI reports all Adverse Drug Reactions (ADRs) in the Provincial Safety Management System (PSMS).
