

What are Quality Improvement Teams?

Health PEI has 21 Quality Improvement Teams (QITs). QITs are responsible to identify quality improvement initiatives pertinent to their program and lead processes to enhance quality and standard of care by meeting and maintaining Accreditation Canada and other national, professional and legislated standards.

Quality and patient safety are key strategic priorities for Health PEI.

The focus of all Quality Improvement Teams is that patients, clients, residents and families receive quality, safe care.

Quick Facts about Quality Improvement Teams:

- Majority are program focused (ex. Surgical Services, Home Care, Pediatrics, Diagnostic Imaging)
- Few are overarching as they involve many programs/areas of care (ex. Medication Management, Leadership, Infection Prevention and Control)
- Membership typically includes:
 - unit/program managers, clinical leads, educators, supervisors, physician,
 Quality Risk Consultant, Health Information Unit Specialist, and Patient and
 Family Partners
 - members come from all Health PEI sites
