Required Organizational Practice (ROP) of the Month

ACCOUNTABILITY FOR QUALITY OF CARE

- The Required Organizational Practice (ROP) for Accountability for Quality of Care states
 that the governing body demonstrates accountability for the quality of care provided by
 the organization. This ROP is part of the Governance Standards.
- The Health PEI Board of Directors serves as the organization's governing body and adheres to the Governance Standards as part of its commitment to quality and safety.

AT HEALTH PEI:

- Quality and Safety is a strategic priority.
- Quality is a standing item at regular meetings of the HPEI Board of Directors. The Board
 also has a Quality and Safety Subcommittee, which provides input on patient safety and
 quality improvement initiatives.
- Organizational quality performance is monitored and evaluated quarterly against established goals and objectives, including strategic performance indicators for quality and safety.
- HPEI's Quality Reporting Structure includes 24 Quality Improvement Teams (QITs) that
 report to the Leadership QIT, which provides feedback on quality initiatives and monitors
 compliance with standards.
- HPEI hosts a biannual Quality and Patient Safety Learning Exchange, bringing together staff, physicians, leaders, board members, and community partners to share and learn about quality and safety initiatives.
