Required Organizational Practice (ROP) of the Month

PATIENT SAFETY INCIDENT DISCLOSURE

- The Required Organizational Practice (ROP) for Patient Safety Incident Disclosure states a documented and coordinated approach to disclosing patient safety incidents to clients and families, that promotes communication and a supportive response, is implemented. This ROP is part of the Leadership Standards.
- Disclosure is the act of informing the patients, clients, or residents, and their families about patient safety incidents.

AT HEALTH PEI:

- There is a **Disclosure of Patient Safety Incidents** policy which outlines the disclosure process. Health PEI's policy is guided by Canadian Patient Safety Institute's Disclosure Guidelines.
- The disclosure process is reviewed and updated as necessary, with feedback from relevant stakeholders.
- Staff receive guidance and support throughout the disclosure process.
- Support is provided to patients, clients, residents, and their families at the time of the incident and continues as needed.
- Critical incident debriefings are held to support staff, understand what happened, and identify opportunities for improvement.

Health PEI staff have an ethical professional and legal obligation to disclose adverse events.

Does Health PEI have a policy on the disclosure of patient safety incidents? Where can I find the policy?

What steps are taken by your manager/supervisor when you report a safety event?

What is the process used to disclose a patient safety event?

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
