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## **Privacy Matters Corner...**



The Health Information Act (HIA) establishes Health PEI's obligations as a custodian of personal health information, including protecting information from unauthorized access, use and disclosure. As Health PEI staff, we all have a duty to ensure we protect information and comply with the HIA.

The Access to Information & Privacy (ATIP) team has been working to identify and develop training and education to support Health PEI staff in relation to meeting our obligations. Most recently, the ATIP team has developed a short training video titled "Snooping & the Need to Know". It is available for all staff to view on the Staff Resource Centre website at:

## PowerForm / iView - Violence Risk Assessment Checklist/Violence Risk Assessment Alert:

### What's new as of February 3rd

- 1.The Violence Assessment Tool Acute is replacing the old Violence/Aggressive Assessment Checklist in ADHOC folder and iView.
- 2. "High Risk Behavior Alert:" will replace the earlier Violence/Aggressive Alert in upper lefthand corner of the patient demographic bar in the electronic chart.
- 3. There is a new "patient safety plan section" to be completed with patient, to name their behavior triggers and modifiers, for improved patient care plans and outcomes.

## What's staying the same?

- 4. If the patient's level of violence risk is moderate, high or very high, the assessing staff can now, in consultation with their manager, supervisor, clinical lead or delegate, complete the violence/aggressive behavior alert authorization form in adhoc.
- 5. If the violence risk diminishes to low level risk during the encounter, the assessing staff can now remove the "yes" High Risk Behavior Alert in consultation with their manager, supervisor, clinical lead or delegate, by completing the Violent/aggressive alert removal form in adhoc.
