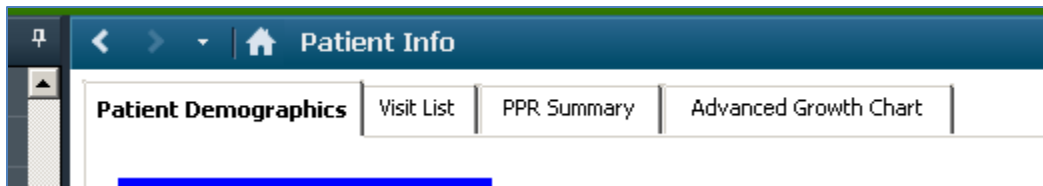


Patient Information Tab:


The **Patient Information** tab consists of multiple sub tabs:

- Patient Demographics
- Visit List
- PPR (**P**atient **P**rovider **R**elationship) Summary
- Advanced Growth Chart



Patient Demographics: Displays patient demographic data entered and controlled by the Registration Department: including

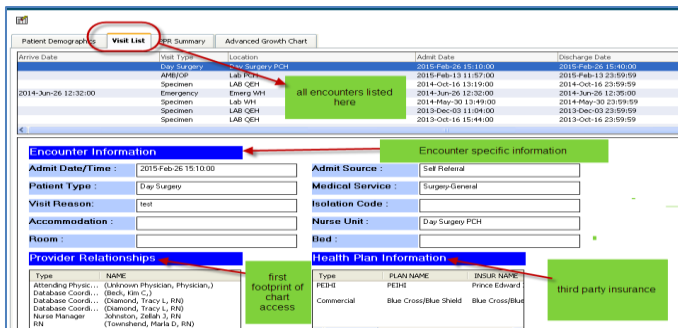
- Name
- Address
- Telephone number
- Religion
- Age
- Marital status

Visit List: Is divided into two sections:

- Visit Reason



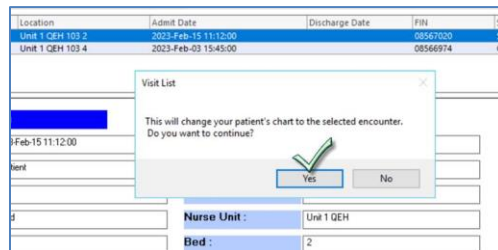
Encounters display in reverse chronological order (most recent at top)

To open a chart from a different encounter:

- Highlighting the encounter (displays in blue)
- Double click on the chosen encounter.

Ensure you have selected the correct encounter to open.

- A Message box appears stating: “This will change your patient’s chart to another encounter.... Do you wish to continue?”



- Select “Yes” to open the chosen encounter.

CAUTION: There is the ability to document on any encounter.

Be careful to document on the correct encounter!

- The Bottom section of this screen contains information specific to the visit/Encounter.

The information displayed includes:

The provincial health number (MRN/PHN),

The admission date and time

Providers who accessed the chart during this Encounter.

This section displays the healthcare providers' relationships to the patient (RN, Consulting Physician)

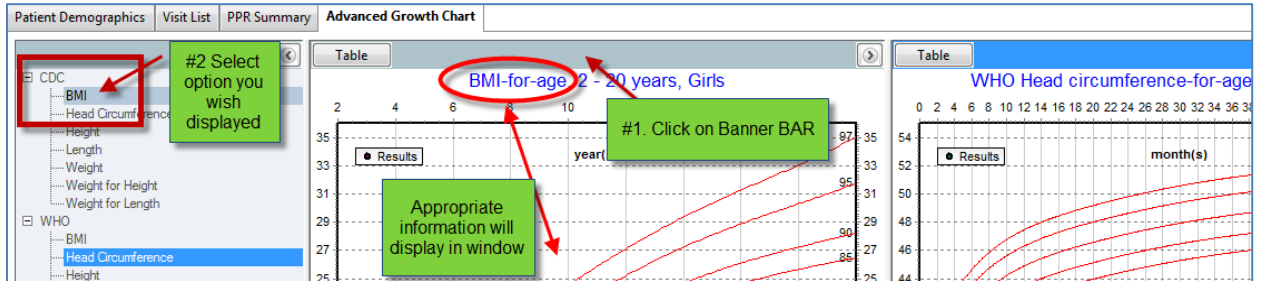

Advanced Growth Chart

The growth chart will open automatically to default settings.

- Growth chart is sex and age (Birth – 20 yrs.) specific.
- Growth charts for females display in red
- Growth charts for males display in blue.
- Information is populated to this screen from documentation made within the chart
- Three different Growth Chart Options to choose from (CDC, WHO and Fenton)



- Options available on the Banner Bar include:
 - Table,
 - Chart,
 - Calculate GV (Growth Velocity)
 - Plot all.
- To select options right click on Banner Bar
