<p align="center">Discharge</p> <p>Complete electronic discharge med rec as you normally would through the orders reconciliation screen.</p>	<p align="center">Transfer</p> <p>Complete Hospital to Hospital transfer through the orders reconciliation screen.</p> <p>This will put medications in a proposed state for the receiving facility.</p> <p>When completing Hospital to Hospital transfer, make sure to choose “TRANSFER”</p> <p align="center">DO NOT CHOOSE “PLAN”</p> <p>*Note – any changes made to medications AFTER hospital to hospital transfer med rec has been completed, will NOT show in the proposed medications at the receiving facility. Therefore, hospital to hospital transfer med rec should be completed as close to time of transfer as possible.</p>	<p align="center">Neither</p> <p>Do NOT complete electronic transfer med rec- there is no communication between our system and the OOP system for transfer med rec to work.</p> <p>Do NOT complete discharge med rec because it alters the BPMH making it inaccurate. This creates med rec issues if the patient is transferred back to a Health PEI acute care facility.</p> <p>What is the process for Medications? Staff on the nursing unit will print the 7/24 eMAR with last dose given and send to the receiving facility</p>
