Background/History

Goal:

- Establish a process to enable inpatients to access their cannabis for medical purposes
- Provide direction to staff who encounter patients using cannabis
- Advocate for patient and family-centred care and respect personal autonomy while maintaining safety & minimizing risk

Approach:

- Developed one comprehensive provincial document that addresses medical and recreational cannabis
- Objectives:
 - Distinguish between medical and recreational cannabis
 - Determine criteria to permit in-facility use
 - Provide direction on smoking, administration, storage and handling



Medical Cannabis (MC)

Policy Definition:

Cannabis that has been prescribed by a physician or nurse practitioner to an individual suffering from a diagnosed condition or illness as a physician-approved therapy that is expected to have some medical benefit, and has been obtained from a Health Canada-approved medical cannabis supplier.

Permitted in facilities with conditions

- Treated similar to a prescribed narcotic
- Health PEI does not supply MC;
 Clients provide their own MC





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Recreational Cannabis

Policy Definition:

Cannabis used for recreational or other purposes, which has not been prescribed by an authorized prescriber and has been obtained from a source other than a Health Canada-approved medical cannabis supplier.

Recreational cannabis is not permitted on Health PEI property

- Exception: LTC residents ONLY
- Treated similar to alcohol
- Cultivation (plants) is not permitted on HPEI Property



Medical Cannabis Use

Permitted for adult medical purposes with an order from the Most Responsible Physician/NP **and** the following criteria are met:

- 1. Client provides proof of authorization to use cannabis for medical purposes under the *Cannabis Act* (formally known as *Access to Cannabis for Medical Purposes Regulations* (ACMPR).
 - A medical document authorizing the use of cannabis for medical purposes, a registration certificate/document issued by a Health Canada approved licensed producer, or a Health Canada authorization document (e.g., registration certificate). See appendix A of the policy for more information.
- 2. Client provides the facility with their own medical cannabis purchased from a Health Canada approved licensed producer.
 - Provincial retail sources will not be filling prescriptions for medical cannabis
 - Health Canada continues to manage cannabis for medical purposes
- 3. Medical cannabis products are in an identifiable and administrable form (i.e., oil, capsule) and requires the client's medication order.



Smoking/Vaping

Smoking/vaping cannabis (**medical or recreational**) is **<u>prohibited</u>** on Health PEI property in compliance with *Smoke-free Places Act* regulations

- Exception: LTC clients ONLY in designated LTC smoking areas
- LTC homes that are smoke-free without a designated smoking area will not be permitting smoking or vaping cannabis
- Smoking cannabis is not permitted at Hillsborough Hospital

Provincial cannabis regulations do not permit smoking cannabis in the workplace or on public property



Client:

- Disclose use of cannabis; Inform HCP if they wish to continue using cannabis for medical purposes
- Provide proof of authorization to use cannabis for medical purposes
- Review and sign the <u>Cannabis for Medical Purposes: Client</u> <u>Information and Acknowledgement Form</u>
- Provide the facility with medical cannabis for from a <u>Health</u> <u>Canada Licensed Medical Producer</u>



Most Responsible Practitioner (MD/NP)

- Provide client/family education
- Assess if medical cannabis is appropriate and safe for the episode of care
- Write an order to authorize (approve) medical cannabis use
 - Ordering information can be obtained from the product label, reported by the client or partner in care, or the medical document from the original prescriber
 - Determine with nursing if client is capable of selfadministration
 - The amount of cannabis prescribed can not exceed the amount authorized by Health Canada.



Pharmacy Technicians:

- Request proof of authorization to use cannabis for medical purposes.
- Document proof obtained in the additional information section of the BPMH*

Pharmacist:

- Confirm that proof of authorization for cannabis for medical purposes has been obtained and documented
- Review and verify the prescriber's order and indicate "patient's own supply"

Nursing Staff

- Document medical cannabis use in the Best Possible Medication History (BPMH)
- Request proof of authorization to use cannabis for medical purposes and place a photocopy on the health record
 - Document proof obtained in the additional information section of the BPMH (This can be completed in collaboration with pharmacy)
- Provide client with the <u>Cannabis for Medical Purposes: Client</u> <u>Information and Acknowledgment Form</u> (available on the Staff Resource Centre).
 - Review information with client/family and document
 - Attach signed form to health record
- Assist with storage and administration



Storage

- Client provides the nursing staff with their cannabis for medical purposes
- Two nurses (RN or LPN) accept and acknowledge the amount received
- The nurses store and lock the cannabis in the narcotic cupboard and treat like a prescription narcotic
- Document the client's name and drug name on the top of the narcotic count sheet. Example: "Cannabis Oil – John Doe"
 - Ensure the cannabis is labeled & has client identification
 - Include quantity received (e.g., mLs, tablets)
 - Both nurses sign the initial entry on the narcotic sheet

Clients are not permitted to store their own medical cannabis at the bedside



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Self-Administration

- Client's are permitted to self-administer their cannabis unless they require assistance or lack of capacity to safely selfadminister
- Nursing & MRP assess capacity to self-administer and discuss an administration plan with client.
- Nursing:
 - Remove cannabis dose from the narcotic cupboard and document on the count sheet.
 - Bring cannabis dose to bedside and witness client self-administer.
 Document in the MAR, indicating "self-administration"

Smoking or vaping medical cannabis is not permitted on Health PEI property



Nurse Administration

- For client's that require assistance or cannot safely selfadminister cannabis, nurses (RN or LPN) are permitted to administer or assist with administration.
- The nurse administers medical cannabis as per the order on the MAR and documents accordingly.
- Cannabis drug information and education is available on the Staff Resource Centre



Discharge & Disposal

- Returning medical cannabis:
 - Two nurses remove and return a client's MC from the narcotic cupboard
 - Document "Patient Discharged" on the narcotic sheet entry line & zero out the quantity
 - Document the return in the health record
- The Pharmacy Department disposes of prescribed medical cannabis left in the facility after a client is deceased.



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Services Provided in the Home

- To promote a smoke-free work environment, clients are asked not to smoke in the home:
 - One (1) hour before a home visit by a healthcare provider
 - During a home visit with a healthcare provider (inside or outside the home)
- See Home Care's Smoke Free Workplace policy and speak to your manager/supervisor asap if a client is unable or unwilling to comply with smoking guidelines.



Services Provided in the Home

- Nurses (RN/LPN) working in home care settings are <u>not</u> authorized to directly administer medical cannabis to clients who are authorized to use it; they are permitted to assist with administration
 - Review the <u>CRNPEI/CLPNPEI Cannabis Practice</u> <u>Directive</u> for administration examples and more information on nurses working in home care settings.



Recreational Cannabis: (LTC ONLY)

- LTC residents are permitted to self-administer lawful recreational cannabis according to <u>provincial regulations</u>
 - Partners in care can assist
 - HCPs are not permitted to provide information to residents on how to prepare or consume recreational cannabis
- Residents must review and sign the <u>Recreational Cannabis</u>: <u>Resident Information and Acknowledgement Form</u>
 - This form outlines Health PEI's rule and client responsibilities for recreational use in LTC



Recreational Cannabis: (LTC ONLY)

- Smoking/Vaping:
 - Only residents can smoke or vape cannabis in a LTC Home's designated smoking area, if the home has a designated area. LTC Homes that are smoke-free without a designated smoking area will not be permitting smoking/vaping of cannabis.
 - Visitors are not permitted to smoke/vape cannabis in a LTC facility or on the grounds, including in any designated smoking areas.
 - Residents who choose to smoke or vape recreational cannabis are first assessed to determine if they can safely smoke independently. See LTC's Smoking Safety Standard.



Recreational Cannabis: (LTC ONLY)

- Cannabis must be securely stored in a locked container in the resident's room out of plain sight from visitors and children
 - The resident is responsible to supply the container and holding the key; the container is **only** used to store cannabis
- Residents are not permitted to share cannabis products with other residents, staff or visitors
- Oral forms of cannabis (e.g., oil, capsules) must be consumed in the resident's room and **not** in any shared area of the LTC Home
