Measles Screening Tool

If the patient/client/resident presents with

- Fever
- Runny nose
- Red watery eyes
- Cough
- Koplik spots (clustered white or bluish-white lesions on the buccal mucosa)
- Red blotchy rash that begins on the head and spreads down to the trunk, arm and legs

Ask the following Questions:		
1.	Has the patient received two doses of measles-containing vaccine after their first birthday?	If Yes: Patient is immune to measles and is to be screened as per routine process.
