# Section 1: General Information



### Our Purpose

In alignment with the 2016 – 2026 Mental Health and Addictions Strategy, Health PEI is building a community first system of care that allows Islanders to receive the care they need, when they need it, in the most appropriate setting as close to home as possible. Culturally safe and competent programs and services must be available to everyone. Services are delivered using the best available knowledge, and are informed by ongoing monitoring and evaluation, including input from those with lived experience. The Mental Health and Addictions Education department is committed to the community first philosophy by providing employees and clinicians with core introductory training, supplementary intermediate training, and advanced education opportunities that support patients and clients in receiving culturally safe and evidence-based care when accessing mental health or addictions service across Prince Edward Island.

The 2024 -2025 education calendar was developed in consultation with a variety of leaders across the division. The document provides employees with an outline of what is expected from their professional roles and what is offered to support onboarding and ongoing learning. We strongly recommend that employees identify their own professional learning needs and arrange a time to meet with their direct supervisor to develop a learning development plan. Professional development and education are essential components of ongoing professional growth within Mental Health & Addictions. Active engagement is necessary in providing opportunities to support learning, mentorship, and wellness for all employees to foster a collaborative and multi-disciplinary team.

Our Mental Health and Addictions Research and Education Department continues to support staff learning opportunities. The department would like to commend staff for their commitment to their ongoing professional development. As we expand our available resources, additional training opportunities will be added. For the most recent training calendar available, please consult the electronic version of this calendar posted on the Health PEI Staff Resource Center.

# Service Delivery Improvements for 2024-2025

- 1. To be more inclusive to new staff and clinicians living and working in Western Prince Edward Island, the education department will now begin to offer our Welcome to Mental Health and Addictions course at Prince County Hospital.
- 2. Due to changes in the online modules for Recovery Oriented Care by Alberta Health Services, Practical Application of Trauma Informed and Recovery Oriented Care has now been changed to Practical Application of Trauma Informed Care. Recovery Oriented Care will now be featured throughout multiple courses offered by the department.
- 3. Emerging from the Multi-Disciplinary Knowledge Exchange, Dr. Jancke Pienaar has agreed to continue his course on borderline personality disorder (BPD) for the division. The course will now continue as a regular course within the calendar.
- 4. Emerging from the Multi-Disciplinary Knowledge Exchange, Ian MacAusland-Berg MA has agreed to continue his course on Introduction to Acceptance and Commitment Therapy for the division. The course will now continue as a regular course within the calendar.
- 5. Autism Spectrum Disorder Modules, SEE, THINK, ACT: Relational Security, have been added to the Two-Week Orientation for all new clinicians and staff starting in the department. MHA Skills Lab: Venipuncture has been added to the Two-Week Training for Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses working within the division.
- 6. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Modules and Coping with Psychosis have been added to Core
  Training for all clinical staff within Mental Health and Addictions. SEE, THINK, ACT: Relational Security
  has been added as a core training requirement for staff working in all Acute & Transition services.
- 7. In partnership with the Office of the Child and Youth Advocate we are pleased to offer a course focusing on the PEI *Child and Youth Advocate Act (2020)*. This course will be offered quarterly in a synchronous virtual format. This course is recommended for all staff and physicians working alongside children, youth and their families.
- 8. Basic Life Support (BLS) Standard will be offered twice a year for new clinical staff entering the division. Basic Life Support (BLS) Refresher will continue to be offered routinely throughout the calendar year.

# How to Select and Register for Training

The Mental Health and Addictions Research and Education Department schedules training on an ongoing basis. The department's goal is to offer core training frequently, to ensure new employees receive training in a timely manner. Several non-core courses (including on-line courses) are offered to enrich the learning and professional development culture in our services. Certain core training requires re-certification at regular intervals, please see core training to evaluate which courses require certification. Please note that some of the introductory courses double as "booster" sessions for staff looking to refresh their knowledge. Registration for all **virtual** and **in-person** training is through **Eventbrite**. Employees will be required to provide contact information in the form of email address and telephone number and will need to frequently check their email after registering for training updates or changes to course information.

Please note that Health PEI work emails must be used when registering for sessions in Eventbrite. If you do not have a Health PEI work email, you will be screened to confirm your employment with Health PEI by mhatraining@gov.pe.ca. Please check your email regularly for course updates.

- 7. If you do not see the course, you are looking for *search for the title of the course* in the search box or copy and paste the URL found in course description section.

#### Additional Information

**Attendance Minimum**: To foster respect for our instructors and participants, when a session's attendance and/or registration is less than six individuals, class **might** be cancelled or rescheduled for another time. Some course guidelines require a minimum number of participants for the partnering organization to certify the participants. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

**Cancellation Policy**: If you are unable to attend a training session you are registered for, you are responsible for cancelling your registration in Eventbrite (via the course registration link) to provide an opportunity for waitlisted registrants access to your seat. If you must cancel on the day of training, please email mhatraining@gov.pe.ca and notify your direct supervisor of the reasons for cancelling. **Course Application Form**: Employees are required to complete the course application form (appendix B) prior to completing the online registration through Eventbrite. Employees are required to obtain their direct supervisors' approval for the course and then scan the form to <a href="mailto:mhatraining@gov.pe.ca">mhatraining@gov.pe.ca</a>.

**Health PEI Orientation**: Health PEI core online orientation modules are required to be completed upon hire. The Mental Health and Addictions Human Resource team will email a letter pertaining to the orientation modules. MHA Continuing Education Verification Form: Please have course facilitators sign your Education Verification form (Appendix A) for you to take back to your work area for submission to timekeeper or payroll person to ensure education hours are captured properly. Staff can print off and bring their own forms, and facilitators will be asked to ensure they have these signed forms available for staff at in-person training sessions.

**The Public Service Commission**: The Public Service Commission provides training for provincial government employees through their Pathways for Learning Courses. For further information please go to: [Public Service Commission Link]

**Storm Policy**: For both facilitators and participants, the Storm Policy follows the government offices' cancelation policy. As Health PEI employees, we are still required to work on days when civil offices are closed. Some training will be held in partnership with civil offices or employees, making cancellation on days when civil offices locations are closed the preferred option. If the civil offices are delayed or closed in the area where training is occurring (Prince, Queens, or Kings), training both virtual and in-person, will be canceled and rescheduled.

**Travel**: Employees are encouraged to schedule training close to your area of work. Compensation for travel for the purpose of training requires approval from your direct supervisor.

#### Welcome to Mental Health and Addictions

The Mental Health and Addictions (MHA) Education Department is pleased to provide clinicians entering MHA services with a welcome orientation into the MHA division of Health PEI. 



This presentation will discuss key components such as cognitive defusion, acceptance, contact with the present moment, values-based Action: And committed action: The goals of ACT are to reduce avoidance and resistance to difficult emotions and experiences, increase psychological flexibility and acceptance, encourage values-driven living, and improve overall well-being and life satisfaction Some of the benefits are reduced symptoms of anxiety, depression, and trauma, improved relationships and social connections and increased resilience and stress management and enhanced overall quality of life.

#### **Emergency Management Training: Incident Command**

PEI Emergency Measures Organization offers training courses throughout the year.
