Health PEI SAFETY TALK ☆ Eclipse Safety ☆

Total Solar Eclipse, April 8th 2024

Much of Prince Edward Island (Prince and Northern Queens counties) is in the path of totality—where the sun will be completely obscured as the Moon passes in front of it. On PEI the eclipse will begin at roughly 3:30 pm, and totality will occur around 4:35 pm.



Sample times for eclipse:

Tignish: 4:35 pm ADT for 3 min 11 sec Alberton: 4:35 pm ADT for 3 min 3 sec Tyne Valley: 4:36 pm ADT for 2 min 22 sec Summerside: 4:37 pm ADT for 1 min 1 sec North Rustico: 4:37 pm ADT for 16 sec

- On April 8th, PEI schools will be dismissed early to ensure students and staff will be home safely.
- Indirect viewing through a pinhole projector (see resources) or live online are other great ways to watch. Try a colander or a Ritz cracker!

DON'T GET BURNED!

Looking at the sun without protection can cause damage to your retina called **solar retinopathy**.

Damage can occur without pain and could be permanent! Be prepared, and protect your eyes with



certified solar eclipse viewers that meet international standard **ISO 12312-2.**

Do not look at the sun through regular sunglasses, a camera lens, or binoculars unless they are equipped with an ISOcertified solar filter.
