High Risk Behaviour Alert

A High Risk Behaviour Alert is a process to encourage Healthcare Workers to assess, identify and reduce triggers, and take a proactive approach to de-escalate aggressive patient/client/resident behaviours. It provides a way to share known information about violence/aggression, and supports implementing a plan to keep everyone safe.

A High Risk Behaviour Alert is indicated for patients/clients/residents who have a history of violence or aggressive be haviour associated with Healthcare Worker injury or where there is potential risk for Healthcare Worker injury.

The High Risk Behaviour Alert process is not intended to stigmatize patients/clients/residents but to encourage Healthcare Workers to identify and reduce triggers and take a proactive approach to de-escalate aggressive patient/client/resident behaviours. Safety measures as part of the care plan associated with a High Risk Behaviour Alert will increase everyone's safety, including the patient/client/resident exhibiting violent or aggressive behaviour.
