JOINT OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEES

WHAT IS A JOINT OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE?

A committee made up of workers and employer representatives who work together to address health & safety issues in the workplace.

WHO NEEDS A JOINT OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE?

Any workplace (or site) that employs twenty (20) or more workers is required to have a Joint Health & Safety Committee

If your workplace has between five (5) and nineteen (19) workers a Health & Safety Representative is required.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE JOINT HEALTH & SAFETY COMMITTEE:

- To meet at least monthly and post the minutes from their meetings
- Conducting regular workplace inspections
- Making recommendations to the employer for improvements to Health & Safety in the workplace
- Encouraging workers to first report hazards to their Supervisor
- Committee members should be knowledgeable of committee requirements. Additional information can be found in the WCB Guide to Joint Occupational Health and Safety Committees
