

# **SAFE DISPOSAL OF SHARPS**

## Accidental exposure to contaminated sharps can expose healthcare workers to blood borne pathogens.

#### How should sharps be disposed of?

Facilities should have sharps containers readily available in areas that sharps are used. Workers should place needles in wide-mouth, puncture-proof containers. Replace containers when they reach the "full mark" on the container. Ensure they are sealed, collected, and disposed of in accordance with local regulations for biomedical waste.

#### Areas you may find sharps inappropriately disposed of:

- In clinical areas on the ground, on surfaces, patient/resident rooms, or in trash cans
- Within materials sent to the laundry facilities
- Attached to equipment / on metal trays, trolleys, or items sent for decontamination
- Within overfilled or incorrectly assembled sharps containers
