

PEI SMOKING CESSATION PROGRAM: TRAVEL SUPPLY POLICY

- 1. **Eligibility for Travel Supply:** Eligible clients must visit a PEI community pharmacy to request a travel supply of medication. Coverage is limited to a single continuous course of treatment, ranging from a minimum of 42 days to a maximum of 126 days for one eligible smoking cessation product. The duration depends on the prescribed medication and the treatment plan.
- 2. **Medication Stabilization Requirement**: Clients must be stabilized on their medications for at least 28 days of regular use before a travel supply can be filled at a community pharmacy.
- 3. **Electronic Claims Submission**: Clients enrolled in the PEI Smoking Cessation Program (SCP) may have claims for a travel supply of eligible Nicotine Replacement Therapy products or prescription drugs electronically submitted to PEI Pharmacare by their community pharmacy prior to leaving the province.
- 4. **Submission of 28-Day Supply:** Pharmacies can submit 28-day supplies electronically on consecutive days, providing the prescription on file permits this.
- 5. **Exceeding Supply Limits:** Clients who request and receive more than the recognized Pharmacare maximum days' supply will be responsible for the cost of any excess supply exceeding that limit.
- 6. **Travel Declaration Form:** Eligible PEI Pharmacare clients must sign a Travel Declaration form. Pharmacies are required to retain completed forms for audit purposes.
- 7. **Processing Claims:** Claims for travel supplies must be processed using the appropriate code.
