Stroke Distinction: Did You Know?

Patient/ Client and Family Education (Part 1)

- Education and self-management support for stroke clients, their families and/or caregivers are integral parts of stroke care that should be addressed at all stages across the continuum.

Tracer methodology will help determine if the stroke education program is:

- Interactive
- Specific to people with lived experience of stroke, family or caregiver needs and abilities
- Timely
- Appropriate
- Up to date

Enhance client experience and improve outcomes

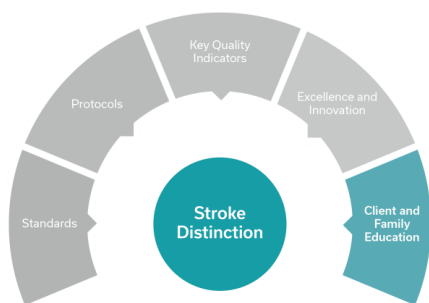
Mitigate risk and increase efficiency

Improve teamwork and communication

The stroke education program will be evaluated through documentation review to determine if education content is:

- specific to the stroke survivor’s phase of care or recovery,
- is appropriate to their readiness and needs, and
- encompasses all aspects of care and recovery across the continuum of stroke care

Evidence of education will be looked for in stroke education forms, clinical progress notes, discharge summaries and checklists. Specific education packages or other resources may also be assessed. Health records will be reviewed to determine if education is appropriate for each stroke client.
