

Incidents Involving Client Identification

Incidents involving client identification are reported and tracked through Health PEI's electronic Provincial Safety Management System (PSMS). Between January 2020 and June 2021, there were **93 client identification incidents** filed in PSMS. Types of client identification incidents include:

- Incorrect labelling of client requisitions or specimens
- Wrong client identifier (name, date of birth, medical record number, personal health number) entered into electronic system during admission/registration
- Incorrect identification band placed on patient/client

Tips to Prevent Client Misidentification:

- 1. Ask the client to state their full name and date of birth and confirm this matches their identification band and other documentation.
- 2. Teach clients to show their identification wristbands to healthcare providers during procedures or transfers.
- 3. Be vigilant in the checking of patient identification at the bedside, particularly during specimen collection, medication administration or before procedures (such as surgical interventions, medical procedures, blood transfusions)
- 4. Review and follow Health PEI's Client Identification Policy and relevant processes/procedures.
- 5. Involve patients/clients/residents and families/caregivers in the identification process.
- 6. Educate patients/clients/residents and families/caregivers about the risks of client misidentification.

Confirming identification ensures that the RIGHT CLIENT receives the RIGHT CARE at the RIGHT TIME.
