Required Organizational Practice: Home Safety Risk Assessment

WHAT IS HOME SAFETY RISK ASSESSMENT?

- A safety risk assessment is conducted for clients receiving services in their home.
- Although the Home Care Team may have little control over risk in a client's home environment, a home safety risk assessment can enhance the safety of clients, families and team members involved in home health services.

AT HEALTH PEI:

- A safety risk assessment is conducted for each client at the beginning of service.
- The home safety risk assessment includes: assessment of a client's falls risk, skin and wound care, client risk factors and medical conditions requiring special considerations, and emergency preparedness.
- The Home Care Team uses this information for planning and delivering client services, and shares this information with partners who may be involved in planning of care.
- The team educates clients and families on the safety issues identified in the risk assessments.
