Required Organizational Practice: Hand-Hygiene Compliance

WHAT IS HAND-HYGIENE COMPLIANCE?

Hand-hygiene is the single most important practice to reduce healthcare
associated infections and the transmission of microorganisms in
healthcare. Hand-hygiene audits allow us to monitor compliance with hand
hygiene protocols, improve education and implement unit or program-based
quality improvements.

AT HEALTH PEI:

- There is a provincial *Hand Hygiene Policy* that was updated in the fall 2021. The policy can be found on the Policy Document Management System (PDMS/MedWorxx).
- **Direct observational audits** of hand-hygiene practices are completed in various programs/areas. Staff are trained to complete observational audits using a standardized tool.
- Hand-hygiene compliance audit results are shared with staff, physicians, volunteers and the public.
- Audit results are reviewed by program/area managers, Infection Prevention and Control staff and Quality Improvement Teams with recommendations being identified and implemented as needed to improve hand-hygiene practices.
