Required Organizational Practice: Narcotics Safety

WHAT IS NARCOTICS SAFETY?

- The availability of narcotic products is evaluated and limited to ensure that formats with potential to cause patient safety incidents are not stocked in patient service areas.
- High dose format narcotics include:
 - Fentanyl greater than 100 mcg per vial
 - Hydromorphone greater than 2 mg per vial
 - Morphine greater than 15 mg per vial in adult care areas and 2 mg per vial in pediatric care areas.

Narcotics are high-alert medications which have an increased risk of causing significant patient harm if they are used incorrectly

AT HEALTH PEI:

- There is a provincial Narcotics and Controlled Drug Policy that is currently in development.
- The current *High-Dose Format Narcotic Policy* is being incorporated into the *High-Alert Medications Policy*.
- Specific narcotics that require an independent double check are identified and outlined in the *Independent Double Check for High-Alert Medications Policy*.
- Audits of high dose format narcotics in patient services areas and pharmacy departments are conducted on a regular basis.
- Audit results are reviewed by the Medication Management Quality Improvement Team with recommendations being identified and implemented as needed.

Questions Accreditation Canada Surveyors May Ask Staff:

Are any high dose format narcotics stocked on your unit? If so, what is the specific reason for having them available in your area?

How do you access additional information if needed to help safe administration of narcotics?

What safeguards are in place on your unit to minimize the risk of narcotic administration incidents?

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
